FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Children of God,

The Church is multi-faceted and always multi-tasking. We gather for worship, fellowship/discipleship and ministry. We baptize the babies, wed the newlyweds and bury our loved ones (hatch, match and dispatch).

Coupled with this multi-tasking is the Episcopal/liturgical churches' tendency to spend a lot of parishioner's time and effort in providing the Sunday morning experience. Trinity focuses on Sunday morning for worship, fellowship and discipleship; church services, fellowship breakfast and Sunday School. These activities take a lot of ministry support such as the Altar Guild, the Flower Guild, the Ushers, the Chalice Bearers, the Lay readers, the Adult Choir, the Casual Band, the Acolytes, the 5 Kitchen crews, the Sunday School teachers and the Children's Chapel leaders. In addition, we have the Cemetery Committee, the Wedding Guild, Martha's Ministry of Food for the sick, Baptismal Receptions, Funeral Receptions, Parish Wide events, Work Days, Office Angels, a website, a newsletter and a Vestry with a Treasurer!

Thinking of Sunday mornings again, I can count 234 parishioner slots that are needed for leading our Sunday activities for one month at Trinity and yet Trinity only had 159 adults and 25 children and youth members to fill those slots in 2010. Again the 234 represents providers and leaders, not worship attenders, breakfast eaters and Sunday School students. So, the result is that a lot of us double and triple up in our efforts to support the Sunday morning experience at Trinity. Frustration and burnout are too common. On the other hand, joy comes to the participant, not the spectator. The grace flows through ministry, not membership.

The Time and Talent Pledge Booklets were mailed out this past Summer and will be offered up in worship on Rally Sunday, September 11th. We are asking each member and friend of Trinity to prayerfully consider their pledge of personally pitching in for our corporate life together. Trinity needs everyone to participate.

This year on Rally Sunday we will also have a Ministry Fair! This is an opportunity for the leaders of each ministry and small group to set up a display and table to educate and encourage everyone. The tables and displays will be set up on the grounds in front of Temple Hall. Please stop by to thank and encourage our leaders! If a ministry or small group captures your attention, you may sign up at the display.

Please bring your Time and Talent Pledges on Rally Sunday, September 11th as we kick off our Fall season together!

Montreat Music Conference

What a great summer! Time to relax, enjoy the sun, fish, grandchildren – it's funny how when you live at the beach, people seem to want to spend more time around you. I have been working hard this summer to accomplish personal goals. One of the most important things I did this summer was attend the Montreat Music Conference of the Presbyterian Association of Musicians. Although it was a wonderful time of spiritual renewal for me, it was also a rigorous schedule of classes pertaining to church musicianship.

I should say there is a lot more than just music going on at this conference. There are lecture series for clergy, family events for children, and other educational opportunities. The daily worship services were wonderful. Special attention was given to the preludes and postludes each day. Everyone would walk in to worship, sit down, and listen to the beautiful offering played by the organist. Then, when the worship service was finished, we all sat back down in our seats and listened to the postlude, after which we then exited the building.

The adult choir had about 400 voices and practiced one hour each morning and another hour each afternoon. We presented special pieces at three of the five worship services, plus participated in the end of the week concert performing four other pieces. The adult choir director, John Dickson, was also the clinician for the choral-conducting class. He gave us wonderful insights into the color of sound and the blending of voices. It was interesting to participate in his lectures and then understand how he implemented his theories during choir rehearsal.

There were two organ-playing clinics during the conference, both led by Janette Fishell. She is an accomplished organist and offered us expert advice on service-playing philosophies and techniques as well as ways to approach the learning of baroque and classical repertoire. The most interesting idea that came from these classes was her take on how to play contemporary music on the organ. She wanted us to feel we could play any style of music on the organ, and pointed out ways to accomplish that.

In my hand bell choir (there were 4 different ones, each with 3 to 5 sets of 5 octaves of hand bells and hand chimes), I was responsible for four bells and four chimes. It may have been the biggest challenge of the week, switching back and forth between the different instruments throughout the music.

I have already started using some of these newly learned techniques here at Trinity. I can't wait for the choir to start back this fall. I have picked out lots of exciting new music for us to sing. We will be singing more contemporary/praise music at the choral service in the sanctuary, but we will also continue to rediscover our traditional musical heritage through the singing of hymns and psalms. Here's hoping you'll be with us.

The recent Trinity Trumpet brought the good news that the Edisto Island Branch of the Charleston County Library is going to be able to use all of the old Parish Hall (Thomas Hall) for its expanded facilities. It's very generous of the Vestry and the Church to give the Library this lease. I am sure the 'new' library will be used even more by the whole community.

There was one error in the article in the Trumpet about the Library. The Trowell and the Guys had absolutely nothing to do with the Library being in the Parish Hall. When Wallace and Amy Trowell moved to Edisto in early December 1971, the library was already established and functioning as a library in the back of the Parish Hall. The librarian was Mrs. Helen Kenner who had to move away from Edisto in January 1972 because her front beach house was severely damaged in an early December storm. After Helen Kenner left, Amy Trowell became librarian.

For four days a week, I subscribe to the Charleston Post and Courier. I have read complimentary articles about Mr. Douglas Henderson, the new director of the Charleston County Library. I'm sure the church's dealings with Mr. Henderson will be pleasant ones.

Thank you for your kind words in the Trumpet about my long tenure as librarian at Edisto. I was there from January 1972 to the end of May 1997 - 25 years. You were exactly right about our "primitive" facilities - the card catalog, no computers, etc.

When my family and I come to Edisto next Christmas, we look forward to seeing the "new" library.

"How the Edisto branch of the Charleston County Library Came to be Located at Thomas Hall"

In the late 1950's or early 1960's, the Charleston County Library decided to open a Branch Library on Edisto Island. The only problem was that there was no building in which to put the library, so it was decided to put the library in a vacant room at the white (segregated) school. That school was in what is now the Edisto Community Center, diagonally across from the Baptist Church. The first librarian is said to have been Mrs. Erlene Jenkins of the Brickhouse Jenkins. The second librarian was Mrs. Helen Kenner. This library was a public library, not a school library.

Fast forward a few years and desegregation came to Edisto Island. The white school was closed, and the library had no place to go. Then Adm. W. W. Kenner, Helen Kenner's husband and Trinity Church came to the rescue. The Kenners had retired to Edisto several years before, living on the front beach on the loop where the 4-lane highway narrows down to 2 lanes. They were very active members of Trinity Church. Adm. Kenner was at various times junior warden, senior warden and treasurer. Helen was president of the ECW (Episcopal Churchwomen) and the church organist. At the time the white school closed, Adm. Kenner was senior warden. He persuaded the Vestry and the Church to give a lease to the Library in the large back room of the Parish Hall. The entrance to the Library was on the church side of the building. The front room of the Parish Hall was reserved for church activities. In later years when Temple Hall was built, the Library was allowed to move to the front part of the Hall, and the old library room was used for choir practice. When Wallace and Amy Trowell moved to Edisto in Dec. 1971, the Library had been in the Parish Hall for a number of years.

In the first week of December 1971, a severe winter storm with extremely high tides hit Edisto Beach. The Kenner's house was badly damaged. Three of their neighbor's houses were washed away. The Kenners decided to move to North Carolina where a family house was available for them. They moved in January 1972.

Amy Trowell replaced Helen Kenner as librarian. She had worked as a librarian in the public libraries in Cleveland, Ohio, and New Orleans, La. She served as librarian at the Edisto Island branch for 25 years from 1972 to 1997.

Helen Kenner published her book 'The Historical Records of Trinity Church, Edisto Island' in 1974. Her research was done when she lived on Edisto. For anyone interested in the history of Trinity Church from 1772-1971, the book is a valuable source of information.
