First Lesson (sit): I Corinthians 15:35-38, 42-45, 51-58

- 35 But someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" 36 You foolish person! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. 37 And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain. 38 But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body. ...
- 42 So is it with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable. 43 It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power. 44 It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body. 45 Thus it is written, "The first man Adam became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. ...
- 51 Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, 52 in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. 53 For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality. 54 When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written:

"Death is swallowed up in victory."

The Biblical Principle of Sowing and Reaping for the Resurrection.

Context - I Cor 15:35 - With what kind of body do they come?"

Concept - Biblical Principle of Sowing and Reaping

I Corinthians 15:36-38 - What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. 37 And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain. 38 But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body.

John 12:24 - Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.

Parable - Sower and four types of soil (Luke 8:4-15)

Our Natural Body is a bare kernel, a seed.


I Corinthians 15:37 - And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain.

Our Resurrection Body will be an Imperishable, Glorious, Powerful and Spiritual Body.

I Corinthians 15:42-44 - 42 So is it with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable. 43 It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power. 44 It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body.

The Resurrection Body of Jesus that we read about in the Gospels is the First Fruits of the Imperishable, Glorious, Powerful, Spiritual, Resurrection Bodies we will be given!

When will this occur? At the Second Coming of Christ

I Corinthians 15:51-57 - 54 When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written:

"Death is swallowed up in victory."

Story of Burying Wey's Father - Edmond Weyman Camp III, MD

Trinity's Worship Service explained -

We gather in worship to <u>remember our past</u> - cursed under the Law (Gal. 3:10ff) and dead in our sin (Eph.2:1), <u>enjoy our present</u> - our new identity and relationship with our Heavenly Father (John 1:12) and <u>taste our future</u> - the Heavenly Banquet with our Savior Jesus Christ! (Luke 14:12ff)

Notice the flow of our worship service; as Believers we are transferred from Old Covenant of Law into the New Covenant of Grace; our confession shifts from the Confession of Sin to the Confession of Faith (Nicene Creed). You are invited to join us!

The Penitential Order. As New Believers the focus is the Confession of Sin. We were condemned under the Law (Rom. 3:20 & II Cor. 3:7-9) but then we heard the Gospel, the Good News of the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus Christ (Acts 2:23,24) and as we repented of our sin and believed in the Gospel we were given a new identify; born again (John 3:3) made a New Creation (II Cor. 5:17), adopted as Children of God (Gal. 4:4-6) and made the Righteousness of God (II Cor. 5:21) His Cross provides forgiveness of all sins, past, present and future (I Peter 3:18, Colos. 2:13), healing from sickness (Acts 10:38, I Peter 2:24) and deliverance from Satan (I John 3:8).

As Mature Believers, the focus is the reaffirmation of the Absolution of Sin. There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. (Rom 8:1). We are reconciled in our relationships with other believers (I John 4:20) and refilled with the Holy Spirit (Eph. 5:18).

The Word of God. The opening prayer "collects" the themes of the scriptures, songs and hymns that day. We hear again His Gospel of Grace (Acts 20:24) in Scripture and sermon.

In response, we stand as Believers and Confess the Gospel in the words of the Nicene Creed (Rom.10:9,10) We kneel and join together in one accord (Acts 1:14) praying for the Church, the Nation, the World, the local Edisto community, the sick and the families of the departed. We then stand and exchange the peace of the Lord (Rom. 5:1) with one another.

The Holy Communion. We celebrate our newness of life (Rom. 6:4) with all the saints in the sacrament of Holy Communion, a foretaste of the Heavenly Banquet, the Marriage Supper of the Lamb (Rev. 19:9) The four major movements include; took, blessed, broke and gave (Matt. 26:26)

Our final prayer, Blessing, hymn/song and Dismissal sends us out as Missionaries with the Truth of the Gospel against the World, the Flesh and the Devil.
