PRAYING FOR NEPAL ...

Nepal is ranked 34th for persecuting Christians. The total population of Nepal is 30,260,000 with Hindu as the major religion and only 4% Christian. Nepal is one of the world's poorest countries with 90% working in subsistence farming. Development is hindered by geographical isolation, difficult land, poor infrastructures, environmental damage, natural disasters and political instability. The first Church started in 1952 with 29 Christians. It grew to 200,000 believers by 1990, and persecution was very strong. Now all 75 districts have at least one Church because of prayer and their willingness to suffer for the gospel. Praise GOD for the Nepali believers' courage to evangelize, even though they risk fines or prison. (www.opendoorsusa.Com).

Luke 4:1-13 Sermon Notes

The Context - the Wilderness - *eremos* - desert, lonely place, uninhabited, forsaken, desolate, isolated.

The wilderness is a season where we learn to rely upon the LORD our God alone, we gain victory over Satan and we receive revelations about the identity of God and our identity. And He prepares us to receive our inheritance.

Luke 4:1 - And Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness.

The Spiritual Disciplines - physical activities we do to open our heart to receive revelations about Who God is and Who he is for me.

The wilderness is a good place, a good season.

Hosea 2:14 - "Therefore, behold, I will allure her, and <u>bring</u> <u>her into the wilderness</u>, and speak tenderly to her. And there I will give her her vineyards and make the Valley of Achor a door of hope. And there she shall answer as in the days of her youth, <u>as</u> at the time when she came out of the land of Egypt.

The response of Jesus to the Temptations. Deut. 6 & 8.

Jesus quotes these Scriptures as he is preparing to walk out of the wilderness and begin to occupy and receive His inheritance.

How does Jesus begin to Receive His Inheritance?

Through His Inheritance Word - Isaiah 61:1-2; Luke 4:18-19

How do Believers begin to Receive Our Inheritance?

Through an Inheritance Word.

8 But you, Israel, my servant, Jacob, whom I have chosen, the offspring of Abraham, my friend; 9 you whom I took from the ends of the earth, and called from its farthest corners, saying to you, "You are my servant, I have chosen you and not cast you off"; 10 fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand. 11 Behold, all who are incensed against you shall be put to shame and confounded; those who strive against you shall be as nothing and shall perish. 12 You shall seek those who contend with you, but you shall not find them; those who war against you shall be as nothing at all. 13 For I, the Lord your God, hold your right hand; it is I who say to you, "Fear not, I am the one who helps you." 14 Fear not, you worm Jacob, you men of Israel! I am the one who helps you, declares the Lord;

Notice: Three times God describes Himself as our Helper, Jacob to Israel, Victories over our Enemies, The elimination of fear and anxiety.

your Redeemer is the Holy One of Israel.
