First Lesson (sit): Genesis 15:1-18

After these things the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, "Fear not, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." But Abram said, "O Lord GOD, what wilt thou give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my

house is Eliezer of Damascus?" And Abram said, "Behold, thou hast given me no offspring; and a slave born in my house will be my heir." And behold, the word of the LORD came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; your own son shall be your heir." And he brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven, and number the stars, if you are able to number them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And he believed the LORD; and he reckoned it to him as righteousness. And he said to him, "I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." But he said, "O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" He said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a she-goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." And he brought him all these, cut them in two, and laid each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. And when birds of prey came down upon the carcasses, Abram drove them away. As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell on Abram; and lo, a dread and great darkness fell upon him. Then the LORD said to Abram, "Know of a surety that your descendants will be sojourners in a land that is not theirs, and will be slaves there, and they will be oppressed for four hundred years; but I will bring judgment on the nation which they serve, and afterward they shall come out with great possessions. As for yourself, you shall go to your fathers in peace; you shall be buried in a good old age. And they shall come back here in the fourth generation; for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet complete." When the sun had gone down and it was dark, behold, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. PRAYING FOR CENTRAL AFRICAN REPUBLIC ...

Despite Christians comprising three-quarters of the population within the Central African Republic, they are still vulnerable to persecution. Since 2013, CAR has been embroiled in conflict and fighting, and most of the country is occupied by militia groups. When Christian leaders publicly denounce the violence, they are often threatened, and their churches ransacked and torched. Conflict in the country has resulted in thousands of Christians losing their homes and livelihood, and many continue to live in Internally Displaced People (IDP) camps.

CAR has been hit hard by the COVID-19 pandemic. Christians were denied government aid and told to convert to Islam if they wanted to eat. The local community will often ostracize Christian converts and might also use violence to try and force them to renounce their faith.

How do Believers Grow in Grace? Disaster or Discipline

The Gospel is the Good News of the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus Christ by which we become the Righteousness of God.

The Spiritual Disciplines - physically activity that helps open my spiritual heart to receive the love of Jesus Christ.

Is this Law? No, this is an activity to open my heart and life to receive more grace.

What is the motivation? Not guilt but love.

My attitude toward the Disciplines is to experiment and have fun.

The Divine Conspiracy; Rediscovering Our Hidden Life In God, by Dallas Willard.

Luke 4:32 - And when it was day, he departed and went into a <u>desolate</u> place. And the people sought him and came to him, and would have kept him from leaving them

Solitude - Do Nothing. Being out of human contact, being alone, for lengthy periods of time.

What does that mean? What do we really do? We turn loose, observe/listen, sit, walk.

What might happen?

I may discover I have a Soul. I may discover that God is near/with me. I may discover that creation is brimming over with His goodness.

Do I need this?

Hurried Life? Multi-tasking? Clutter? Sunset Fatigue?

Matthew 11:28-30 - The Message - "Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me and work with me—watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace. I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you. Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly."

How do we do Solitude?

Daily Quiet Time - devotional prayer time alone with God, every day.

Walk/Sit - extended time, only gentle sound of nature

Retreat - Edisto Beach or local church, alone with God.

Trinity's Worship Service explained -

We gather in worship to <u>remember our past</u> - cursed under the Law (Gal. 3:10ff) and dead in our sin (Eph.2:1), <u>enjoy our present</u> - our new identity and relationship with our Heavenly Father (John 1:12) and <u>taste our future</u> - the Heavenly Banquet with our Savior Jesus Christ! (Luke 14:12ff)

Notice the flow of our worship service; as Believers we are transferred from Old Covenant of Law into the New Covenant of Grace; our confession shifts from the Confession of Sin to the Confession of Faith (Nicene Creed). You are invited to join us!

The Penitential Order. As New Believers the focus is the Confession of Sin. We were condemned under the Law (Rom. 3:20 & II Cor. 3:7-9) but then we heard the Gospel, the Good News of the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus Christ (Acts 2:23,24) and as we repented of our sin and believed in the Gospel we were given a new identify; born again (John 3:3) made a New Creation (II Cor. 5:17), adopted as Children of God (Gal. 4:4-6) and made the Righteousness of God (II Cor. 5:21) His Cross provides forgiveness of all sins, past, present and future (I Peter 3:18, Colos. 2:13), healing from sickness (Acts 10:38, I Peter 2:24) and deliverance from Satan (I John 3:8).

As Mature Believers, the focus is the reaffirmation of the Absolution of Sin. There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. (Rom 8:1). We are reconciled in our relationships with other believers (I John 4:20) and refilled with the Holy Spirit (Eph. 5:18).

The Word of God. The opening prayer "collects" the themes of the scriptures, songs and hymns that day. We hear again His Gospel of Grace (Acts 20:24) in Scripture and sermon.

In response, we stand as Believers and Confess the Gospel in the words of the Nicene Creed (Rom.10:9,10) We kneel and join together in one accord (Acts 1:14) praying for the Church, the Nation, the World, the local Edisto community, the sick and the families of the departed. We then stand and exchange the peace of the Lord (Rom. 5:1) with one another.

The Holy Communion. We celebrate our newness of life (Rom. 6:4) with all the saints in the sacrament of Holy Communion, a foretaste of the Heavenly Banquet, the Marriage Supper of the Lamb (Rev. 19:9) The four major movements include; took, blessed, broke and gave (Matt. 26:26)

Our final prayer, Blessing, hymn/song and Dismissal sends us out as Missionaries with the Truth of the Gospel against the World, the Flesh and the Devil.
