Gracious Father, whose blessed Son Jesus Christ came down from heaven to be the true bread which gives life to the world: Evermore give us this bread, that he may live in us, and we in him; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

First Lesson (sit): Joshua 4:19-5:1, 9-12

The people came up out of the Jordan on the tenth day of the first month, and they encamped in Gilgal on the east border of Jericho. And those twelve stones, which they took out of the Jordan, Joshua set up in Gilgal. And he said to the people of Israel, "When your children ask their fathers in time to come, 'What do these stones mean?' then you shall let your children know, 'Israel passed over this Jordan on dry ground.' For the LORD your God dried up the waters of the Jordan for you until you passed over, as the LORD your God did to the Red Sea, which he dried up for us until we passed over, so that all the peoples of the earth may know that the hand of the LORD is mighty; that you may fear the LORD your God for ever." When all the kings of the Amorites that were beyond the Jordan to the west, and all the kings of the Canaanites that were by the sea, heard that the LORD had dried up the waters of the Jordan for the people of Israel until they had crossed over, their heart melted, and there was no longer any spirit in them, because of the people of Israel.

And the LORD said to Joshua, "This day I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you." And so the name of that place is called Gilgal to this day. While the people of Israel were encamped in Gilgal they kept the passover on the fourteenth day of the month at evening in the plains of Jericho. And on the morrow after the passover, on that very day, they ate of the produce of the land, unleavened cakes and parched grain. And the manna ceased on the morrow, when they ate of the produce of the land; and the people of Israel had manna no more, but ate of the fruit of the land of Canaan that year.

But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet; and bring the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and make merry; for this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to make merry. "Now his elder son was in the field; and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. And he called one of the servants and asked what this meant. And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has received him safe and sound.' But he was angry and refused to go in. The Spiritual Discipline of Study

Sermon Notes

How do Believers Grow in Grace? Disaster or Discipline

The Gospel is the Good News of the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus Christ by which we become the Righteousness of God.

The Spiritual Disciplines - physically activity that helps open my spiritual heart to receive the love of Jesus Christ.

Is this Law? No. Why should I do it? Not guilt but love.

The Spiritual Discipline of Study

John 8:31-32 - 31 So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, 32 and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

The Truth not The Law.

John 1:17 - 17 For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

What is The Truth? Jesus

John 14:6 - 6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

All of Holy Scripture is about Jesus Christ;
Who He Is and What He Does.

A bible study on the Road to Emmaus:

Luke 24:44-47 — 44 *Then he said to them, “These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled.”* 45 *Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures,* 46 *and said to them, “Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, 47 and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem.*

Knowing The Truth will set you free.

Know - *ginosko* - relational, experiential knowledge. Not so much academic intellectual head knowledge but spiritual heart knowledge.

How Do We Engage in the Spiritual Discipline of Study?

Three Extrinsic Aids mentioned in The Celebration of Discipline, Richard Foster, p.68.

1. **Experience** - “is the only way we can interpret and relate to what we read.”

Adults learn about a subject when we are interested in a subject.

2. **Other Books** - subjects “often have meaning only when they are read in relation to other writings.”

The ESV Study Bible, Commentaries on Holy Scripture.

3. **Live Discussion** - “the ordinary interaction that occurs among human beings as they pursue a particular course of study.”

Trinity offers three weekly opportunities

Trinity's Worship Service explained -

We gather in worship to remember our past - cursed under the Law (Gal. 3:10ff) and dead in our sin (Eph.2:1) , enjoy our present - our new identity and relationship with our Heavenly Father (John 1:12) and taste our future - the Heavenly Banquet with our Savior Jesus Christ! (Luke 14:12ff)

Notice the flow of our worship service; as Believers we are transferred from Old Covenant of Law into the New Covenant of Grace; our confession shifts from the Confession of Sin to the Confession of Faith (Nicene Creed). You are invited to join us!

The Penitential Order. As New Believers the focus is the Confession of Sin. We were condemned under the Law (Rom. 3:20 & II Cor. 3:7-9) but then we heard the Gospel, the Good News of the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus Christ (Acts 2:23,24) and as we repented of our sin and believed in the Gospel we were given a new identify; born again (John 3:3) made a New Creation (II Cor. 5:17), adopted as Children of God (Gal. 4:4-6) and made the Righteousness of God (II Cor. 5:21) His Cross provides forgiveness of all sins, past, present and future (I Peter 3:18, Colos. 2:13), healing from sickness (Acts 10:38, I Peter 2:24) and deliverance from Satan (I John 3:8).

As Mature Believers, the focus is the reaffirmation of the Absolution of Sin. There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.(Rom 8:1). We are reconciled in our relationships with other believers (I John 4:20) and refilled with the Holy Spirit (Eph. 5:18).

The Word of God. The opening prayer "collects" the themes of the scriptures, songs and hymns that day. We hear again His Gospel of Grace (Acts 20:24) in Scripture and sermon.

In response, we stand as Believers and Confess the Gospel in the words of the Nicene Creed (Rom.10:9,10) We kneel and join together in one accord (Acts 1:14) praying for the Church, the Nation, the World, the local Edisto community, the sick and the families of the departed. We then stand and exchange the peace of the Lord (Rom. 5:1) with one another.

The Holy Communion. We celebrate our newness of life (Rom. 6:4) with all the saints in the sacrament of Holy Communion, a foretaste of the Heavenly Banquet, the Marriage Supper of the Lamb (Rev. 19:9) The four major movements include; took, blessed, broke and gave (Matt. 26:26)

Our final prayer, Blessing, hymn/song and Dismissal sends us out as Missionaries with the Truth of the Gospel against the World, the Flesh and the Devil.

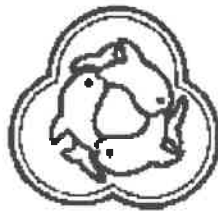
