

Intro - School yard story of Wey.

Ephesians 1:3-4 - 3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, 4 even as he **chose** us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him.

1. Chosen - eklegomai - to make a choice, to select, to prefer. Verb in the Aorist Tense meaning it was a definite decision and action in the past.

Why am I chosen? Not because I am the Best or the Worst, but because of Love.

Deuteronomy 7:7-8 - 7 It was not because you were more in number than any other people that the Lord set his love on you and chose you, for you were the fewest of all peoples, 8 but it is because the Lord loves you and is keeping the oath that he swore to your fathers, that the Lord has brought you out with a mighty hand and redeemed you from the house of slavery, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt.

John 15:13,16 - 13 Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. ... 16 You did not choose me, but I chose you

Ephesians 1:5 - In love 5 he <u>predestined</u> us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will,

2. Predestined - proorizo - To come to a decision beforehand, to determine and decide ahead of time. Connects to

"Destination."

Destination - Adoption as sons (and daughters).

How do I know? By my response to The Gospel.

When I Repent and Believe in the Gospel, then I know.

The Gospel is the Good News of the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Ephesians 1:13 - In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, **the gospel** of your salvation, and **believed** in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit.

How do I know, down deep in my heart?

State - my current situation, my emotional state, my mental state, my physical state. How I am right now.

Status - my permanent identity, my position, my station in life.

The Gospel changes not my State but my Status. If I want this Gospel Truth to move from my head to my heart then I need to say it out loud.

Stories of Who are you?

TRINITY'S WORSHIP SERVICE EXPLAINED . . .

We gather in worship to <u>remember our past</u> - cursed under the Law (Gal. 3:10ff) and dead in our sin (Eph.2:1), <u>enjoy our present</u> - our new identity and relationship with our Heavenly Father (John 1:12), and <u>taste our future</u> - the Heavenly Banquet with our Savior Jesus Christ! (Luke 14:12ff)

Notice the flow of our worship service; as Believers we are transferred from Old Covenant of Law into the New Covenant of Grace; our confession shifts from the Confession of Sin to the Confession of Faith (Nicene Creed). You are invited to join us!

The Penitential Order. As New Believers the focus is the Confession of Sin. We were condemned under the Law (Rom. 3:20 & II Cor. 3:7-9) but then we heard the Gospel, the Good News of the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus Christ (Acts 2:23, 24) and as we repented of our sin and believed in the Gospel we were given a new identify; born again (John 3:3) made a New Creation (II Cor. 5:17), adopted as Children of God (Gal. 4:4-6) and made the Righteousness of God (II Cor. 5:21). His Cross provides forgiveness of all sins, past, present and future (I Peter 3:18, Colos. 2:13), healing from sickness (Acts 10:38, I Peter 2:24) and deliverance from Satan (I John 3:8).

As Mature Believers, the focus is the reaffirmation of the Absolution of Sin. There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus (Rom 8:1). We are reconciled in our relationships with other believers (I John 4:20) and refilled with the Holy Spirit (Eph. 5:18).

The Word of God. The opening prayer "collects" the themes of the scriptures, songs and hymns that day. We hear again His Gospel of Grace (Acts 20:24) in Scripture and sermon.

In response, we stand as Believers and Confess the Gospel in the words of the Nicene Creed (Rom.10:9,10). We kneel and join together in one accord (Acts 1:14) praying for the Church, the Nation, the World, the local Edisto community, the sick and the families of the departed. We then stand and exchange the peace of the Lord (Rom. 5:1) with one another.
