FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Children of God,

South Carolina Gamecocks or Clemson Tigers?
Citadel Bulldogs or College of Charleston Cougars?
North Carolina or Duke? Georgia or GaTech?

What happens when our team scores? Wins the game? We jump up and say "We won!" But did I make the basket? Did I grab the rebound? Make the assist? No. But my team won, and so I say "We won!"

This is an illustration of **Salvation by Representation** which is exactly what the Apostle Paul is revealing in his letter to the Corinthians - **Firstfruits!** Just as Jesus was raised from the grave never to die again, so it will be for Believers in the Gospel! **We Win!**

*20 But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the **firstfruits** of those who have fallen asleep. 21 For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. 22 For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. 23 But each in his own order: Christ the **firstfruits**, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. (I Corinthians 15:20-23)*

We were once "in Adam" - lost in our sin. But then the Holy Spirit opened our spiritual hearts to hear the Gospel, the Good News of the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. And our hearts were set on fire with love, gratitude and appreciation for the amazing sacrificial love of Jesus. So we repented of our Sin and put our trust (faith) in His Cross and Resurrection for our salvation. Now we are "in Christ!"

Believers have switched teams! No longer "in Adam" - represented by the sin of Adam. But now "in Christ" - represented by the Righteousness of Christ! **Salvation by Representation!** Just as Jesus Christ wins, so it is for those of us on His Team - We Win!

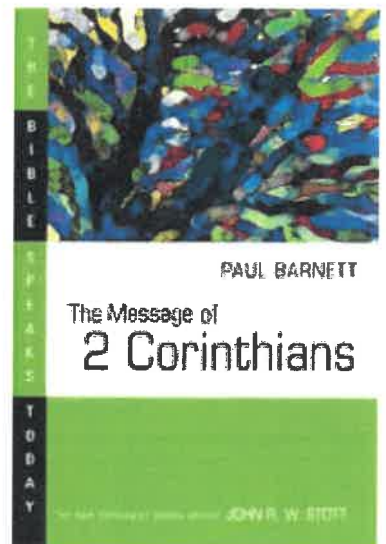
We hope you will join us each Monday as we discover the treasures God has to meet all of life’s challenges!

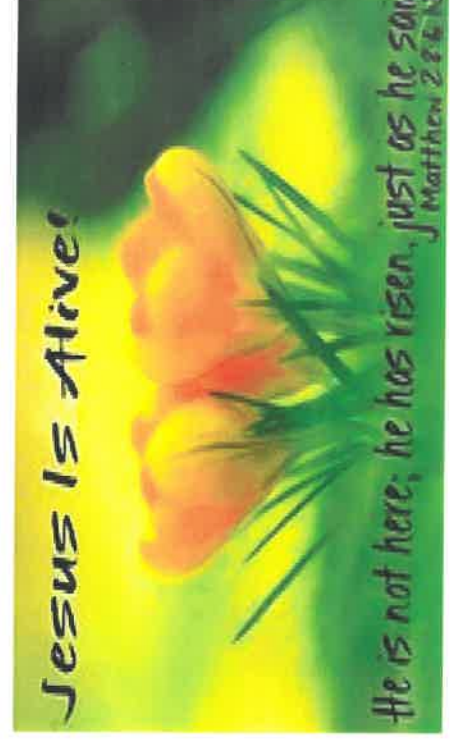

CATHOLIC CHARITIES ADDS SMILES BACK TO THE UPSTATE

“Smile and the world smiles with you, cry and you cry alone.” Stanley Gordon West got it mostly right in his 1949 book, *Growing An Inch*. Smiles do indeed draw positive responses.

Those crying because of aching teeth, however, are not crying alone any more. They now have an advocate: Catholic Charities of South Carolina, which is helping to ease their pain in several ways.

Jessica Thrall, site administrator for Catholic Charities in the Upstate, said the organization has

partnered with several groups to restore lost smiles. “We take our oral health for granted until something happens,” she said. Jessica said students from the Greenville Tech dental program hold wellness workshops for clients who will be receiving dentures. The workshops teach people about proper nutrition, brushing, flossing and overall dental care.

Catholic Charities also has partnered with Affordable Dentures & Implants in Greenville, which performs partials and dentures. But that means a lot for somebody who has lost teeth and is suffering. “It gives them hope,” Jessica said. She also said the organization has formed a partnership with Palmetto Denture Care in Spartanburg, which has stepped up to do partials and extractions for Catholic Charities clients. “It’s nice to offer all those options,” she said. “This makes a world of difference” in the lives of people who have dental pain and have lost teeth. “They can’t eat certain foods. They can’t get the right nutrition, and their health suffers,” Jessica said of her Save A Smile clients. “Almost all of them are very depressed because they don’t feel like they look good.”

Giving clients their smiles back builds confidence, which in turn energizes their search for jobs and raises their self esteem, Jessica added. People turn to Save A Smile because dentures are out of their price range and “This is kind of their last resort.” The majority of clients are older people who are surviving on a small income. “The cost of dentures is really expensive to them, and they don’t have the access to preventative and restorative care that they need,” she said. Catholic Charities screens them, makes appointments and gets them the help they need. “One lady had her dentures for almost 20 years, and she lost them.” Jessica said Catholic Charities reached out to help her replace them. Another client received her appointment during the week of Thanksgiving. “You are giving me my life back ... how much more thankful can I get?” a woman named Teressa said. Mattie, another satisfied client, said she can eat better with her new dentures and “everyone notices” her big, beautiful smile now.

The world, indeed, is smiling with Mattie and Teressa, thanks to Catholic Charities.

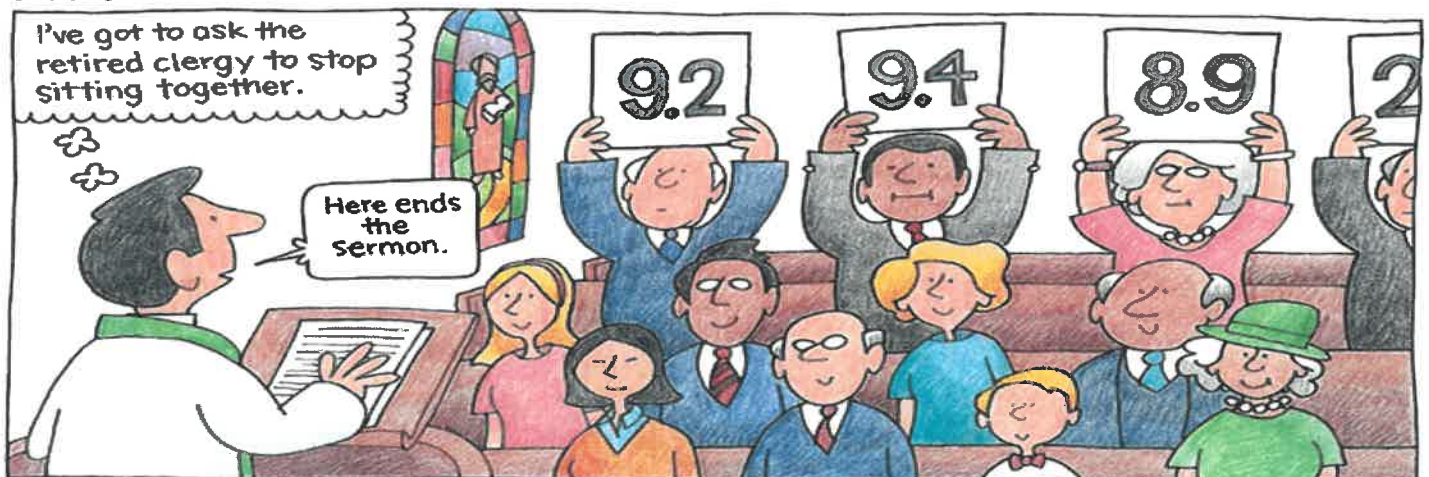

What is Cursillo?

- * “Cursillo” is Spanish for “a short course.” It is a movement of the church. Its purpose is to help those in the church understand their individual callings to be Christian Leaders.
- * Cursillo is designed for the participant to “get away” from the daily routine, to listen to the Spirit and live for three days in Christian Community so that through study, worship, fellowship and introspection, one might sense the deeper calling of Christ in their lives to further service in His Church and in mission to the world.
- * The overall goal of Cursillo is the goal of the Church: to bring all to Christ. This is done when informed, trained Christians set out with the support of others having a similar commitment. The Cursillo Weekend takes people who are already Christians and gives them foundational training based on the New Testament Christianity and helps them further discover their own “apostolic calling” based on their individual spiritual gifts!
- * But most of all the Cursillo Weekend is about experiencing the unconditional Love of Jesus and Christian brothers and sisters in a way that you probably never have before. It is a taste of “Heaven on earth” and it is very often a life-changing event for participants!

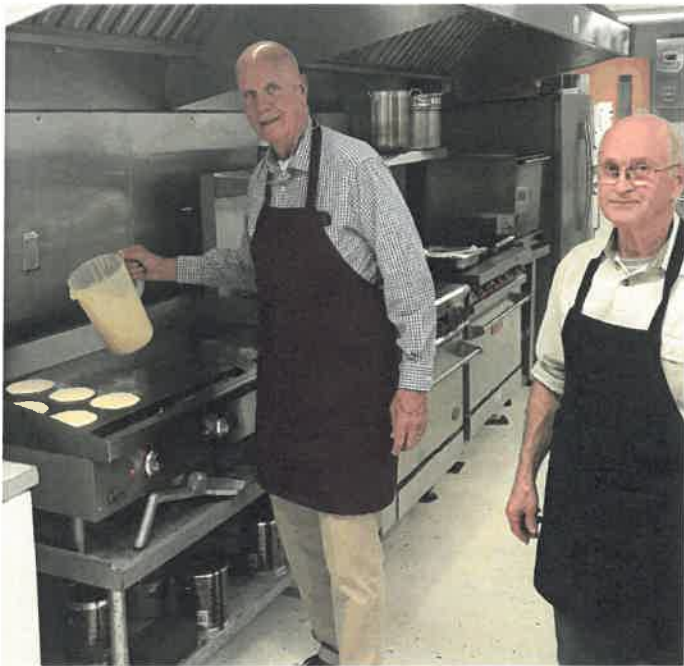

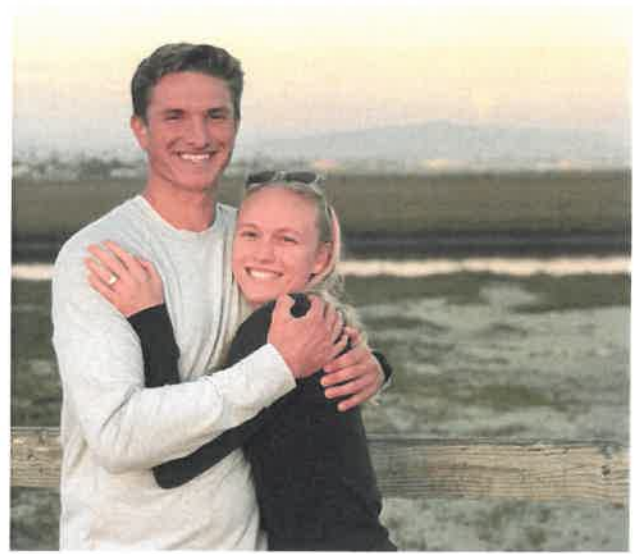

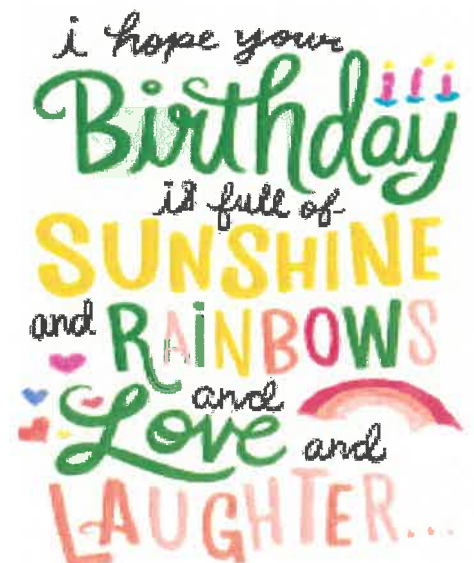
