Dear Children of God,

Ash Wednesday, February 22nd, is a day to focus on our own morality, including the morality/loss of a loved one. What happens? We grieve.

While working with terminally ill patients, Swiss-American psychiatrist, Elizabeth Kubler-Ross described the grief cycle in her book, <u>On Death and Dying</u> in 1969.

The first stage is **Denial**, which helps us survive the loss. The world seems meaningless and overwhelming. Denial helps us cope and survive and pace our feelings of grief. Another stage of grief is **Anger**. There are other emotions under the anger and we will get to them, but first it is important to be willing to feel the anger. Anger can be shocking to us, anger at all kinds of things, including God. The anger is an indication of the intensity of our love for the one who was lost. **Bargaining** is the stage of grief where we desire a temporary truce, and guilt is often bargaining's companion. I should have, I could have, I would have, what if, if only, if only.... I had done things differently. **Depression** is not a sign of mental illness but a normal and appropriate response to great loss. Empty feelings present themselves and can settle in for a season. We are sad and tired; why? Because our body is expending energy dealing with the depression caused by grief. **Acceptance** is not being "Ok" with our loss but rather accepting the new reality that our loved one is physically gone from this life. This is the new norm and we are learning to live with it. (www.grief.com)

Grief is not a straight process. We may shift in and out of each area of grief in a moment of time. A picture, a memory, a smell sets off a new "wave" or area of grief. What are we to do?

Talk to our family and mature Christian friends. <u>Talking is a great step of healing</u>. Turn to Holy Scripture and see what grace is available in the midst of our loss. The Cross, Resurrection and 2nd Coming of Savior Jesus Christ brings healing and security. **Pray** - Take our hearts to our Father in Heaven, even if it means letting Him know how angry we are! Finally, **Exercise**; for example, taking long walks is very helpful in processing the grief in our hearts.

What is Cursillo?

- "Cursillo" is Spanish for "a short course." It is a movement of the church. Its purpose is to help those in the church understand their individual callings to be Christian Leaders.
- Cursillo is not designed to meet every spiritual need of every individual or group in the church. It is designed for the participant to "get away" from the daily routine, to listen to the Spirit and live for three days in Christian Community so that through study, worship, fellowship and introspection, one might sense the deeper calling of Christ in their lives to further service in His Church and know how to move forward on this journey.
- The overall goal of Cursillo is the goal of the Church: to bring all to Christ. This is done when informed, trained Christians set out with the support of others having a similar commitment. The Cursillo Weekend takes people who are already Christians and gives them foundational training based on the New Testament Christianity and helps them further discover their own "apostolic calling" based on their individual spiritual gifts!
- <u>But most of all</u> the Cursillo Weekend is about experiencing the unconditional Love of Jesus and Christian brothers and sisters in a way that you probably never have before. It is a taste of "Heaven on earth" and it is very often a life-changing event for participants!






A special thank you to Jim Murray of Edisto and Donald Colby of Meggett for volunteering their time and working with us for the entire week




