FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Children of God,

One of the classic ways of **learning is by contrast** - seeking to identify meaningful differences. We use this method every Sunday morning when we begin by reading the summary of The Law and then I say, "What I have just read is not the Gospel." **The Law is not The Gospel.**

Who does the action? Under The Law, I do. The Two Greatest Commandments say, you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart ... you shall love your neighbor as yourself. Mark 12:30,31 You shall, you shall. But under The Gospel, Jesus does the action. St. Paul writes that Christ died for our sins ... that he was raised on the third day. I Corinthians 15:3,4

Which way does the love flow? Under The Law, it flows from me to God, from me to my neighbors. But under the Gospel it flows to me from my Heavenly Father and to me from my Neighbor Jesus Christ.

Finally, **How do we respond?** Under The Law, I obey. Under The Gospel I repent and believe. The first words from Jesus in Mark's Gospel - "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel. Mark 1:15.








Know One Another - Small Groups




