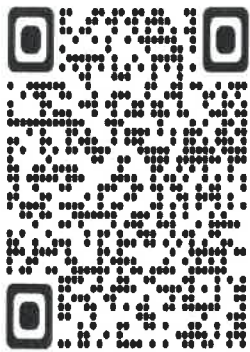
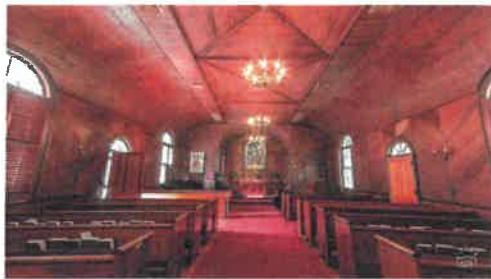

Rejoicing:

On August 17, 2022, six (6) additional churches had their property rights affirmed by the South Carolina Supreme Court; Church of the Holy Cross (Stateburg), Church of the Holy Comforter (Sumter), St. Jude's (Walterboro), Old St. Andrew's (Charleston), St. Luke's (Hilton Head) and Trinity Church (Myrtle Beach).

Thirty-six (36) churches joined the lawsuit and now 28 have had their property rights upheld. **Trinity Church, Edisto Island had its property rights upheld in the April 20th ruling.**

Weeping:

Eight (8) churches, in addition to St. Christopher Camp and Conference Center, have been called for the transfer of their deeds; Church of the Good Shepherd (West Ashley, Charleston), Christ Church (Mt. Pleasant), Holy Trinity (South Windermere, Charleston), St. Bartholomew's (Hartsville), St. David's (Cheraw), St. Matthew's (Ft. Motte), St. James (James Island), and St. John's (Johns Island).

In addition, they are praying and seeking a nominee to be a delegate to our Diocesan Convention, also a three year term. **Please offer suggestions to the committee or let them know of your own willingness to serve.**

Only adult members who are “members in good standing” are eligible for nomination. Our pledging Friends of Trinity, although active and much loved, are not eligible. “All Members over the age of 17 who, for the previous 12 months have a recorded pledge of time, talent and treasure will be considered “Members in Good Standing” and allowed to vote at Annual Meetings and Special Meetings.” (Trinity By-Laws Article IV, Section 4.2) In addition to the monthly vestry meeting, each vestry member is asked to coordinate and give leadership to a particular area of our life together as the Family of God. The idea is to ask an active member to prayerfully consider leadership. Please make your suggestions to one of the committee members.

“The Nominating Committee shall solicit from the Congregation nominations from the vacancies on the Vestry and shall distribute to the Parish, not less than 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting, a list of nominees. Other floor nominations shall also be allowed if a Member in Good Standing is nominated by two (2) other Members in Good Standing in writing with said Nominee’s name being submitted to the Church office in writing at least two (2) weeks before the Annual Meeting.” (Trinity By-Laws Article VI, Section 6.4)

The proposed nominating schedule will be as follows:

November 6th - The slate of nominees is presented in the November Trumpet and Sunday bulletin.

November 20th -Any additional floor nominations presented in the Sunday bulletin.

December 4th - Annual Meeting and Election at 9:30am, Meech Room.

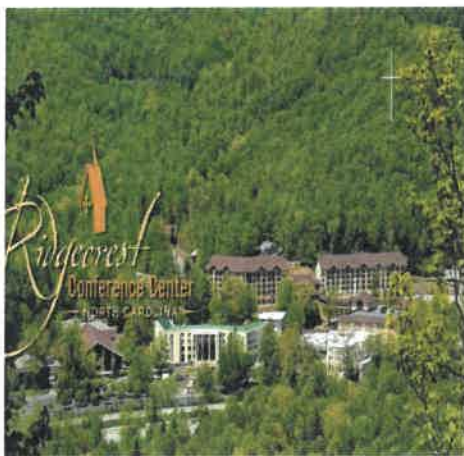
Diocesan Announcements

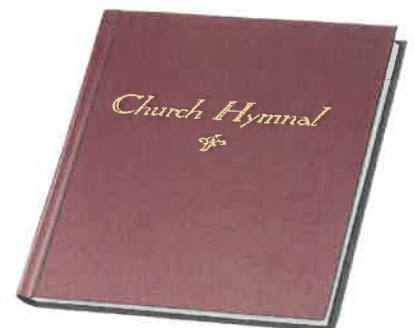

“NO HOMEWORK BIBLE STUDY”

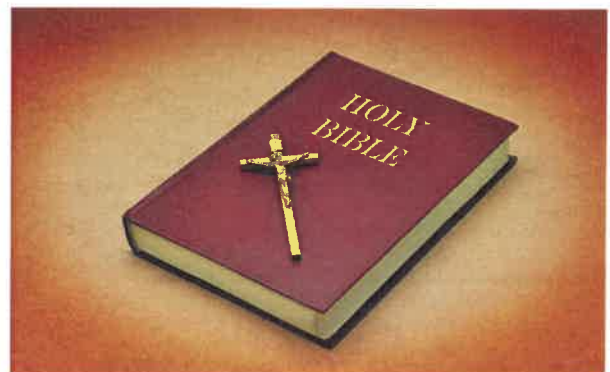

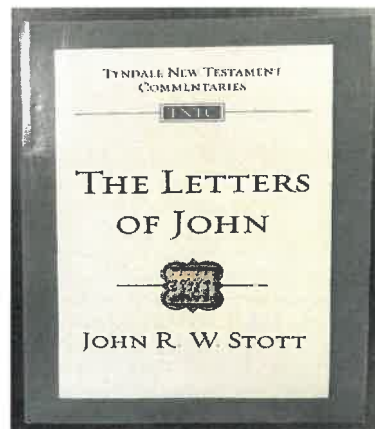

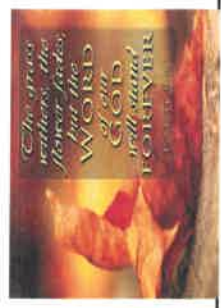
