

Dear Children of God,

The biggest gift of grace that we receive as Believers is the complete and total forgiveness of all our sin!

Colossians 2:13 - 13 And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us <u>all</u> our trespasses.

All our trespasses, All our sin, has been forgiven; All our Past, All our Present, All our Future. All.

How do we know this? Because it occurred at a particular point and place and time in history - The Cross of Jesus Christ! Good Friday.

Please offer suggestions to the committee or let them know of your own willingness to serve.

Only adult members who are "members in good standing" are eligible for nomination. Our pledging Friends of Trinity, although active and much loved, are not eligible. "All Members over the age of 17 who, for the previous 12 months have a recorded pledge of time, talent and treasure will be considered "Members in Good Standing" and allowed to vote at Annual Meetings and Special Meetings." (Trinity By-Laws Article IV, Section 4.2) In addition to the monthly Vestry meeting, each Vestry Member is asked to coordinate and give leadership to a particular area of our life together as the Family of God. The idea is to ask an active member to prayerfully consider leadership. Please make your suggestions to one of the committee members.

"The Nominating Committee shall solicit from the Congregation nominations for the vacancies on the Vestry and shall distribute to the Parish, not less than 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting, a list of nominees. Other floor nominations shall also be allowed if a Member in Good Standing is nominated by two (2) other Members in Good Standing in writing with said Nominee's name being submitted to the Church office in writing at least two (2) weeks before the Annual Meeting." (Trinity By-Laws Article VI, Section 6.4)

The proposed nominating schedule will be as follows:

November 5th - The slate of nominees is presented in the November Trumpet and Sunday bulletin.

November 19th -Any additional floor nominations presented in the Sunday bulletin.

December 3rd - Annual Meeting and Election at 9:30am, Meech Room.




The Beach Service Continues in September!







Know One Another - Small Groups Sowing Circle

September with the Sowing Circle:

- TOADS for babies??? Absolutely. The Sowing Circle has been making "toads" for the NICU at MUSC. Toads are like bean bags that the nurses use to position the tiny babies. They are soft flannel and have to be replaced each year as they are washed so many times.
- Blankets for Palmetto Infusion Center: The Sowing Circle will be donating blankets to the Palmetto Infusion Center in Beaufort. Each blanket will have a Bible Verse about healing. These blankets are brightly colored and warm for those receiving an infusion which can take many hours.
- Fidget Quilts: Fidget Quilts are used primarily for dementia patients. Each quilt is unique. They may have zippers, snaps, velcro, pockets, elastic, beads, bells or squeeze balls. They are used in nursing homes to stimulate and occupy patients. We have an assortment. Our first ones will go to the Ridgeland Nursing Home.
- We continue making pillowcases, incubator covers, luo pads with lady bags and tie fleece blankets. We always need help sewing, cutting, ironing, putting on snaps and tying blankets so plan to join us this month Saturday, September 16th at 10:00am in Miss Jane's building.
